Commitment

Participation

When new review opportunities emerge, panel members will be consulted for their perspectives to test that the needs and preferences of the target audience(s) are met. If by teleconference, a date and time common to the majority of the panel members will be arranged. If by email or online means, panel members will be given at least ten (10) days to provide their feedback on the tool or project, according to the input needed . All comments and feedback will be taken into consideration; final decisions on content will be made by the leaders of the given project under review.
