
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### **SAVE THE DATE FOR OUR 2024 AGM**

# STUDY FINDS THAT MOST BLOOD PRESSURE DEVICES IN PHARMACIES ARE VALIDATED

A study published in the Canadian Journal of Cardiology found that almost all of the blood pressure devices found in pharmacies were on our list of recommended devices, while the most popular devices from online retailers (Amazon, Walmart, Best Buy, and Canadian Tire) were not on our list. <u>Click here</u> to read the full study.

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## THE RXPATH STUDY ON OUR PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION PROGRAM HAS BEEN PUBLISHED

Recently, the Canadian Pharmacists Journal published a study that was done with pharmacists on our Professional Certification Program (PCP). The goal of the study was to determine whether the patients of pharmacists who took the PCP course had lower systolic blood pressure. 104 pharmacists were involved in the study, along with 890 patients. Ultimately, the study found that pharmacists who completed our PCP course saw a 4.76 mmHg systolic BP reduction in their patients at 3 months. Additionally, patient satisfaction was high. It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Dr. Peter Bolli, recipient of Hypertension Canada's Distinguished Service Award in 2019 and Certificate of Excellence in 2015. Dr. Bolli was a dedicated physician and a renowned researcher in hypertension. His career took him around the world, and he continued his clinical practice and research until his early 80s. Dr. Bolli was a beloved teacher at Memorial University and McMaster's Faculty of Medicine, and he received numerous awards for his contributions to public health, particularly in the field of hypertension management.
